

## State Orders Regarding Businesses and Activity Restrictions Due to COVID-19

**8/30/2021:** The CDC’s new guidelines for face masks now state that fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance. If you are fully vaccinated, to maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others, wear a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission. Many states are aligning their mask guidance to align with the CDC.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued an Order on January 29, 2021, effective February 1, 2021, requiring the wearing of masks by travelers to prevent spread of the virus that causes COVID-19. Conveyance operators must also require all persons onboard to wear masks when boarding, disembarking, and for the duration of travel. Operators of transportation hubs must require all persons to wear a mask when entering or on the premises of a transportation hub.

	<p>MIOSHA State Emphasis Program (SEP) issued, focused on office settings, remote work policies. In MIOSHA's COVID-19 Emergency Rules, employers are required to create a policy prohibiting in-person work for employees to the extent that their work activities can feasibly be completed remotely. Under statute, MIOSHA can cite employers, require abatement, and fine them up to \$7,000 for failing to produce a remote work policy or if the employer's preparedness and response plan is non-compliant.
